English and Maths

English

Through the Power of Reading, the children will be exploring journalistic style followed by historical fiction.

The children will continue learning about the grammatical structures within the English language.

<u>Maths</u>

The children will be learning Algebra and Ratio:

- use simple formulae
- generate and describe linear number sequences
- express missing number problems algebraically
- find pairs of numbers that satisfy an equation with two unknowns
- enumerate possibilities of combinations of two variables
- solve problems involving the relative sizes of two quantities where missing values can be found by using integer multiplication and division facts
- solve problems involving similar shapes where the scale factor is known or can be found
- solve problems involving unequal sharing and grouping using knowledge of fractions and multiples



Science and Topic Hermitage

<u>Art</u>

The children will be looking at a variety of propaganda posters linked to World War Two. They will make WW2 gas masks and create their own posters.



<u>History</u>

The children will be learning about the end of World War One as well as finding out about the causes of World War Two.



<u>Science</u>

In Animals including humans – The art of being human, the children will be learning to identify and name the main parts of the human circulatory system as well as describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood.



Other Foundation Subjects

<u>R.E.</u>

The children will continue learning about Christianity. 'Is anything ever Eternal?' is the key question children will be exploring.

Computing

The children will continue using *Purple Mash.*

French

The children will be revising time and mealtimes. For example, breakfast is at 8:00 and for breakfast you can have toast and cereal.

<u> PE</u>

This term in PE, children will continue to develop the fundamental skills of balance, co-ordination and agility through our 'Real PE' programme. They will also be learning the rules and skills required to play tag rugby. Pupils will also have the opportunity to put these skills to the test in our 'intra tag rugby tournament' later in the term.
