



Rights Respecting School Survey Jan 2018

Summary from survey findings:

Out of 184 students that were surveyed, 45% knew one or more right that relates to the Children's Rights Convention. Other outcomes from the survey showed that majority of the children enjoy being at school, feel safe and respected. Students are happy with themselves and feel that their teachers listen to them. 55% of students stated that they can influence the decisions made in school, 21% said they are 'not sure' and 18% said 'no'. The survey highlighted that only 42% found their peers helpful only 'sometimes' which is an area the school will need to work on.

Moving forward, a pupil led steering group has been set up with Year 2 students. During our weekly, lunchtime meetings we will discuss how we can influence and drive forward children's rights. As a school, we have ordered several resources to accommodate the teaching of children's rights in classrooms. Members of pupil led steering group will be provided badges so that they are identifiable around school. Teachers will be asked to implement the teaching of children's rights during one PSHE lesson every half term. Teachers will be provided posters to display in their classrooms which have all 42 articles in a child friendly language. Important articles that need to be recognised by all children will be displayed around the school. Work in PSHE lessons will focus on how pupils treat each other.
