## ENGLISH

Hermitage

This half term, Year 4 will be starting a new graphic novel called 'Mouse, Bird, Snake, Wolf. Children will begin to explore various themes incorporated within and begin to look at wider global issues.

In Year 4, we will continue to be writing a variety of genres and there will be a heavy focus on up-levelling their work.



## **MATHS**



Year 4 will continue to follow the National Curriculum guidelines for Mathematics, and will be studying **money**, time and an introduction into statistics.

Year 4 will continue with weekly mental maths and times tables tests, so please ensure you practice these skills at home.

## **HISTORY**



Our topic for this half term is the Anglo-Saxons. We'll be researching who the Anglo-Saxons were, the influence they had on Britain and what life was like in a typical Anglo-Saxon village.

## **SCIENCE**

Year 4 will look at animals, including humans. We will explore how our bodies digest food and learn the names and functions of the digestive system. In addition to this, we will also learn about the impact of different foods on our digestive system. We will look at different types of teeth found in animals and their simple functions. We will also investigate what causes tooth decay and why it is important to take care of our teeth.

Faraday – Wednesday and Thursdays this half term.

### <u>ART</u>



Children in Year 4 will be studying Picasso and looking at his painting techniques. They will be creating their own portraits in the style of his work.



Year 4 will return to their study of Judaism.



Our topic for this half term will be continuing the work of 'Healthy Me'. There will be a focus on maintaining a healthy relationship with those around us.

## **COMPUTING**



We will continue to follow the 'Purple mash' scheme of work. This term we will be looking at animation.

## **HOMEWORK**

Daily practice sheets are set Mon-Thurs.

A longer piece of homework (either English or maths) is sent out on Friday and due back the following Monday.

Spellings are sent out on a Friday and children will be tested the following Friday.

## HOW CAN I SUPPORT MY CHILD AT HOME?

### Reading

Ensure you hear your child read every day and record this in their reading record. Encouraging your child to take responsibility for being heard reading and completing the reading record will develop their independence skills.

Reading can take a variety of forms. They can read their chosen library books, or another text that interests them.
