News from the Head of School

Dear Parent / Guardian.



This term is proving to be a busy one already, with lots of workshops, activities and school trips already on the calendar.

Year 3 & 4 will be attending the Harvest Celebration at St Margaret's Church on Monday 16th October where they will be performing Harvest songs, poems, and readings. Parents are welcome to join them from 9.30am. As part of our Harvest celebrations, Hermitage families have been donating food and toiletries: these will be taken to St Margaret's where they'll be distributed via their foodbank to members of the community.

The 4th-10th October is National Space Week and so we have The Immersive Theatre visiting the school to carry out a space workshop with all year groups.

Year 6 will be visiting the Battle of Britain Bunker to support their curriculum topic of World War II. Some of our children from this year group will also be visiting Ruislip High School for a maths workshop.

Thank you to all parents who completed our annual Parent Survey in June 2023. We had a total of 87 parents engage with the survey. The Senior Leadership Team have met to discuss the feedback, and below are some of the actions that we have revisited and implemented:

- Class teachers will continue to post the weekly 'Peek into Next Week' class Dojo post.
- The 1:1 reading books should be changed once weekly. We ask that children re-read the book a number of times to develop their fluency.
- To support with congestion via the school entry path, Year 5 children are dismissed from the small hall door.
- 4. To support with communication, all formal information will be sent via email and celebrations and general feedback via class dojo.
- The introduction of this newsletter which is to be sent every fortnight on a Wednesday, sharing key news and information.
- 6. The Parents Information Afternoon held two weeks ago enabled a lot of core information about each year group.
- Regular coffee mornings each term to allow senior leaders and parents to continue to grow our partnerships.
- We are also going to be arranging sessions for parents to join their child's class. Further information to follow on this.

Attendance Update



It is vital that our children attend school, on time, every day, in order to gain the greatest benefit from their education.

96.7% is the national average for school attendance

95-100% (less than 10 days absence in a year) is good attendance and anything

97% or above is excellent - although **100%** is what you should be aiming for.

Schools aim for a total attendance figure of 96% and above.

Our attendance figure is currently:

96.13 % (compared to 95.21% Sept)

There has been a total of 140 lates since school started in September.

Please make sure your child is in school ready and prepared to start the school day on time at 8.35am for the soft start.

Lateness can cause embarrassment to your child, make it harder for them to settle and cause interrupted learning to your child and the rest of their class.

The school has a responsibility to record all absences and lates. This information is shared with the Local Authority on a monthly basis. Persistent lateness can result in Local Authority intervention.

School Times

All children are expected to arrive and to be collected punctually each day.

School Times are:

Gates Open: 8.25 am

School Starts 8.35—8.45 (soft start)
Children who arrive after 8.45 will be marked as late in the register

School Closes: 3.15pm
