The Learning Environment

I as a Parent/Guardian will:

- Make sure that my child arrives at school by 8.35 am and collected by 3.15 pm each day
- Plan family holidays outside of term dates
- Make sure that my child is wearing appropriate school uniform and that their PE kit is brought into school at the beginning of each week
- Inform the school immediately of any absences related to sickness, appointments (all attempts should be made to arrange health appointments outside of school hours)
- Promote and discuss the values within our Caring Code, School Pledge and Manners

A Happy, Healthy Community

I as a Parent/Guardian will:

- Let the school know of any concerns or worries that may be affecting my child's learning, behaviour or ability to do homework, as this can then be resolved quickly
- Support the school by encouraging my child to develop a positive attitude towards our diverse, multi-cultural community
- Attend meetings with my child's teacher and other staff, aiming to be positive and productive, working towards moving my child on in their learning
- Support and work with you to ensure that the behaviour and discipline policies of the school are maintained, particularly with my child
- Encourage a positive attitude towards my child's education and our school. If I have any concerns, I will come and discuss them with you as it is much healthier to work out solutions and move on
- Read all information sent via email as this gives me important details of relevant policies, meetings, workshops, activities, newsletters and open days

Homework

I as a Parent/Guardian will:

- Support the school by making sure that weekly homework tasks including daily reading are completed and returned on time. A child who hasn't completed their homework is often an unhappy, worried one!
- Use my talents and experiences to enhance my child's learning at home – Your child will benefit greatly from what you can show them, discuss with them and teach them
